This is a condensed version of the Jamboree package, if you want the complete outline please email me and I will send it to you. Most of what has been taken out is of general medical information for the state of PUEBLA.

Welcome

For those flying in to Mexico's Benito Juarez International Airport Mexico City) or Hermanos Serdan Airport (Puebla) there will be a general meeting room where information will be provided. As I understand it there will be buses available from the airports to the camp at discounted cost, I will try to find out the cost from each airport.

Jamboree Location

The Raised Stones Valley in Zacatlan, Puebla is located in the mountain area in the southern part of Mexico near the Gold Coast. Since it is in the mountains the weather during the summer time is mild and wet, (hopefully we have mild and dry) the temperature during the summer ranges from between 12° and 16° C. With the camp at 2500 meters above sea level we should be prepared for cool nights.

Travel Documents

We will hand out the International Travel Document Package that we used for International Events as a visa is not required, only your Passport and Immigration Tourist Form is required, those first time youth traveling Internationally will require their own Passports.

Camp Registration and Fees

The camp is open to the following sections.

Cub Scouts (Timber Wolves)	7 –11 years
Scouts & Guides (Explorers & Sr. Explorers)	12 –16 years
Rovers (Rover Knights)	17 –22 years

Scout Leaders (those over 22years old) will be assigned activity responsibilities as required. The approximate registration cost will be no more than 300 Euros, *approximately* (\$ 520.00) Canadian, depending on the exchange rate at the time of registration.

The fee includes the following, and other things yet to be established:

1. Ready –made meals
2. Transport to and from activity sites
3. Material for activities
4. Accident Insurance
5. Emergency Service 24hrs (ambulance)
6. Fee coverage for various events and activities
7. Artistic and Cultural events

The Insurance coverage is only in effect form July 16th – July 23rd of 2011 while at the Jamboree site and activities, this should not be any problem as we will have Out of Country Insurance too.

Sub-Camps

There will be 5 Sub-camps with mixed youth from all sections, I have a few questions to ask on this as to the sizing of the tents, I will inform everyone attending as to the outcome re-guarding tents.

General Services / Logistics

1. showers and washrooms
 2. drinking water
 3. 24 hr internet service
 4. buses to and from various venues
 5. stage for artistic and cultural expositions
 6. emergency service
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1. Scout shop
 2. Food Store
 3. Dinning rooms and kitchen
 4. Corner shop

Activates

Some of the activates include

1. workshops with NGO's and indigenous groups
2. aquatic activates at lake Olmitemetl
3. Farm activates
4. tours in Zacatlan, Cuetzalan and Chignahuapan
5. per-Hispanic ruins, Yohualichan and Tajan
6. hikes and excursions
7. cultural activities and more

Vaccinations

Compulsory

1. Tetanus – Diphtheria
2. Hepatitis A
3. Typhus

And whatever your own doctor recommends for the area that we will be in.

Estimated costing

This is only to give you some idea as to the cost, actual costs will be determined at flight bookings and camp registration, as well as any further information of costs from the Jamboree committee in Mexico.
